

Sharing as a prosocial activity

A child had one of three choices:

- Hard choice: give the sticker to the sad puppy or keep it
- 2. Neutral choice: give the sticker to sad puppy or throw it away
- 3. No choice: give the sticker to sad puppy

Sharing as a prosocial activity

Follow up experiment:

All children were given 3 stickers

Given the *choice* to give *none*, 1, 2, or all stickers to Ellie the Sad Elephant Toy

Hard choices make for better sharers

... making a prosocial choice at a personal cost causes children to continue to be prosocial when faced with a new choice.



AusTrakka as a prosocial experiment

- Labs have the option of participating
- Individual lab data will be visible to everyone else (no private/confidential metadata)
- All labs get to see their genomic data in the context of others
